Too Busy for a *Pro Bono* Case?

The Lawyer of the Day program provides an opportunity for volunteer attorneys to offer pro bono services with minimal commitment. Managed by The Legal Aid Society of Salt Lake in close partnership with the UT Courts Self-Help Center, volunteer attorneys take screened phone calls from the public and provide answers to their legal questions. Self-Help will provide you a warm transfer and identify the apparent, underlying legal question before transferring the call to you—saving you both time and headache.

How It Works

Q: Where do I receive *pro bono* phone calls?

A: Volunteer attorneys provide the program coordinator with their direct phone line, preferably a cell phone.

Q: Will the caller know my cell number?

A: No. Your phone number is confidential and never released to the public. Self-Help court attorneys receive the incoming call and forward it to you.

Q: What's my commitment to the litigant?

A: After you're done with the call—you're done with the litigant.

Volunteer

Volunteers can sign up for weekly, biweekly, or monthly time commitment of one hour or longer. When your scheduled time commitment is over, the calls stop. Volunteers enjoy being featured in The Utah Bar Honor Roll. Pro Bono services have never been so easy.

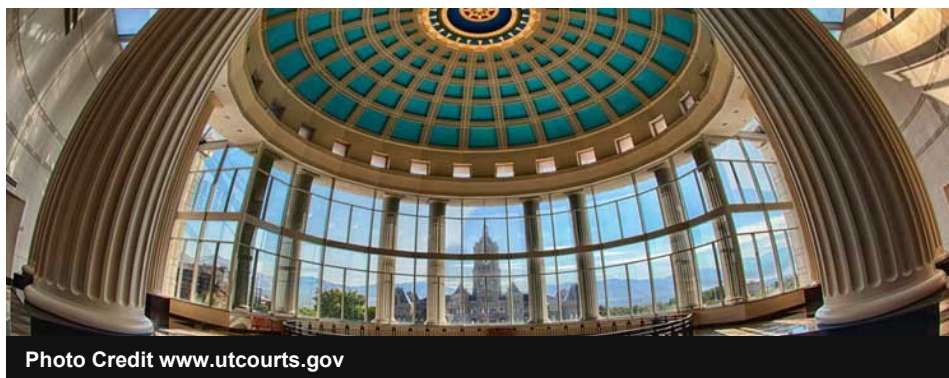


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
